Jimmy Santiago Baca is an award-winning American poet and writer of Chicano descent. While serving a five-year sentence in a maximum security prison, he learned to read and began to turn his life around, eventually emerging as a prolific artist of the spoken and written word. He is a winner of the prestigious International Award for his memoir, *A Place to Stand*, which is now also a documentary by the same title. In addition to over a dozen books of poetry, he has published essays, stories, and a screenplay, *Bound by Honor*, which was made into a feature-length film

MACS 199: Innovation Illinois: From Accessible Design to Supercomputing Cultures

The course introduces the histories of interdisciplinary innovations from the Urbana-Champaign campus in engineering, humanities, sciences and the arts. We will explore how local histories of Illinois innovations help us understand today's innovation trends and processes, from the growth of new design centers on university campuses to contemporary accessibility design. As part of a final research project, students will team produce a short-form video documentary using a variety of primary sources, from interviews and news media to materials drawn from the University Archives.
